- 1 **Rebecca Shepherd Floral Design**
Coxcombs, Queen Anne's lace, thistles, craspedias, roses, viburnums, peonies, radishes, and seeded eucalyptus
- 2 **Blossom and Branch**
Cymbidium orchids, nigellas, scabiosas, artichokes, ferns, myrtle, bush ivy, and Japanese plum tree branches
- 3 **QuatreCoeur**
Peonies, ranunculuses, garden roses, sweet peas, tulips, lisianthus, and seeded eucalyptus
- 4 **Hatch Creative Studio**
Echinaceas, artichokes, dahlias, ranunculuses, freesias, and seeded eucalyptus
- 5 **Fleurs**
Dahlias, hydrangeas, Queen Anne's lace, garden roses, geraniums, tracheliums
- 6 **Melarosa**
Dahlias, roses, hydrangeas, callalilies, orchids, and hypericum berries
- 7 **Poppies & Posies**
Garden roses, peonies, craspedias, chamomiles, lavender, Queen Anne's lace, thistles, spirea, mint, and moss
